For Quinn Holler we have Becky Coleman, for Alex Burnham we have Michellie Martinek , and for Korey McDonald we have Marianne Snyder.

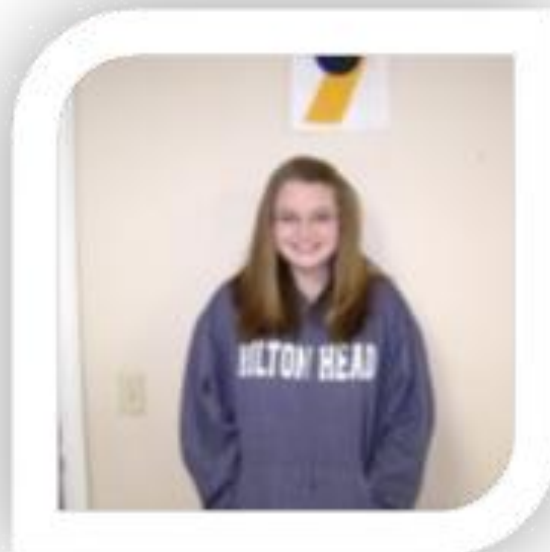
You won't want to miss this exciting and inspiring service. Remember, it is also communion and Pentecost Sunday. Don't forget to wear something red.

Don't Miss the Beach Celebration!!

The National Home Safety Council (www.homesafetycouncil.org) has some tips for keeping your home safe.

Prevent Falls- have grab bars in showers and tubs; bright lights over stairs and steps; handrails for stairs on both sides of the stairs; use a ladder instead of furniture for reaching high items and lastly have baby gates at tops and bottoms of stairs.

Prevent Poisoning- lock poisons out of reach of children and confused people; Keep all cleaners in original containers; Use medication carefully, following directions and keeping out of reach of children; Install carbon monoxide detectors in sleeping areas. Call the Poison control center if someone takes poison, Poison Control Center 1-800-222-1222.

Prevent Fires and Burns- Have working smoke detectors; Stay by the stove when cooking; Keep space heaters at least 3 feet away from anything that can burn and turn them off when you go to sleep; only light candles if an adult is in the room and blow out candles when you leave the room or go to sleep.

Prevent Choking and Suffocation- if something fits through a paper towel tube a child can choke on it; place children to bed on their backs, with no pillows, comforters or toys in the crib; Keep window cords out of reach of children; read all labels on toys and make sure your child is old enough to play with them. Be sure that your child is sitting while eating and taking small bites of food.

Water safety- Stay an arm's length of children while in and around water; Put a fence up around a pool; Empty large buckets and wading pools after use and keep upside down when not in use; Make sure children always swim with a grownup and never swim alone; keep hot water at or below 120° F to prevent burns.

God's Love Knows No Bounds... Strengthen the Church

Close your eyes. Imagine a church that spans boundaries. Now open your eyes... and see Iglesia sin Fronteras/Church without Borders UCC, serving people from both sides of the Ciudad Juárez-El Paso border. Strengthen the Church is helping this new church start!

The UCC's Southwest Conference has had Hispanic congregations, including Iglesia La Trinidad UCC in El Paso, Texas, since its founding. Lay people from La Trinidad have been crossing to the Juárez site to do social service work. Las Iglesias Cristianas Congregacionales de Mexico, concentrated on Mexico's Pacific coast, have a strong sense of mission to their brothers and sisters in Mexico's north. Members of Iglesia Congregacional de Mazatlan have made the 20-hour bus ride to minister to people attracted from the interior of Mexico by jobs in the border plants around Juárez. To the Spanish-speaking community of Ciudad Juárez and El Paso, the two cities on either side of the border have always been one; and it is in this spirit that this new church is being established.

Christ expects us to feed the hungry and heal the sick. Work guided by Pastor Raúl Blanco Valdez is meeting those expectations: diabetes testing, reading classes, health education, vision and dental clinics. Women are learning income-generating handcrafts, youth are helped with drug problems, and children are offered English and computer classes. The congregation worships in a sanctuary constructed by volunteer work groups from across the UCC.

Our vision is that this church will provide a strong Protestant witness to lower- and middle-income people attracted to the economy of the Mexico/USA border. We expect this partnership to bless communities where God's love knows no bounds.

Mission Moment - The Church in Every Moment
Seventh Sunday of Easter
June 5, 2011

The rhythm of our lives often changes during the summer, which is a good thing. It's wonderful if we're able to slow down and enjoy the beautiful outdoors, to stop and smell the flowers, and perhaps even to take a little vacation. But the rhythm of life in the church rarely skips a beat, even though some congregations may experience a few empty pews on Sunday mornings as folks travel and "take a Sunday off."

Our churches know that the regular work of the gospel goes on, day in and day out, in every season. The worship and pastoral needs of the local church, the justice work in the broader community, and the wider mission of the United Church all go on, even in August, and they are supported by the faithful giving of the people in the pews, whose generosity never takes a vacation.

Thank you for remembering to give generously in support of your church's ministry, even on Sundays when you are away from your own local congregation. Thank you for sharing the abundance with which you have been blessed so that the church, in every moment, can continue to be sign of God's healing and tender mercies in a beautiful but broken world.
